Then she saw my Moonflower blossoming. The vine puts on a spellbinding show at sunset when a beautiful green-and-white spiraled bud that looks to be made of meringue transforms into a 5-inch pure white saucer right before your eyes in just over a minute.

were away on vacation (... remember when we used to go away?) and watched the flowers open in the evening.

This year I gave my neighbor a few seedlings when I grew seedlings of my own. She has created beautiful trellises for hers AND she was proud to announce that she had SEVEN blossoms on a single vine one recent evening. I've never had more than five.
