## **EVER HEARD of the EGYPTIAN WALKING ONION?**

I hadn't either until I saw this contorted blossom in a friend's flower arrangement. Courtesy of her I soon had some bulbs. Some interesting facts about the plant:

- 1. It is a member of the allium/ onion family (Allium cepa var. proliferum).
- 2. Young plants may be used as scallions in the spring, and the bulblets may be used in cooking similarly to regular onions, or preserved by pickling.
- 3. It is similar to common onions but with a cluster of bulblets where a normal onion would have flowers.



- 4. "The hardy bulbs set bulblets on stalks. Air-bound bulblets will sprout new smaller stalks, which fall over and replant themselves, hence the name Walking." 1
- 5. And yes, it adds real interest to a flower arrangement.
